



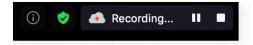

Background: How We Got Here

The FY 21-22 Tribal Set-Aside is HHD's first tribal set-aside funding opportunity

Award Proposal Summary

We propose the following approach to funding decisions given the level of oversubscription:

- 1. Incorporate FY 22-23 Set-Aside funds to double the set-aside opportunity
- 2. Make award decisions using a base allocation and proportional distribution of remaining amounts
- Include all eligible applicants, including those who submitted a Letter of Interest
- 4. Facilitate TA, conduct outreach, and answering questions



Proposal pt. 1: Incorporate FY 22-23 Set-Aside Funds

Proposal: Combine the planned tribal set-aside for FY 2022-23, totaling \$17.5M, with the FY 2021-22 set-aside. This would increase the total set-aside to \$35M.

Justification for proposal:

- The need for program funding far exceeds the \$17.5 million in funding available in the FY 2021-22 set-aside
- Rolling in FY 2022-23 funding will allow for larger allocations, better meeting the level of need and promoting the longer-term sustainability of new programs



Proposal pt. 2: Base Allocation & Proportional Distribution of Remainder

Proposal: Provide a base allocation to all submitters and proportionally distribute remainder among all applicants.

Base amounts:

BFH: \$325,000

Home Safe: \$325,000

HDAP: \$450,000

Justification for proposal:

- Provides minimum funding amounts necessary to stand up programs
- Enables all submitters to receive at least some level of viable program funding



Proposal pt. 3: Include all eligible applicants and LOI submissions in award decisions

Proposal: Award funding to all applicants, including allowing those who submitted a Letter of Interest (maximum of base allocation), as well as eligible applicants that are tribal nonprofits, consortium, and tribal organizations.

Justification for Proposal:

- There is a high level of need for this funding across communities
- Need can be met by both Federally Recognized Tribes and other tribal entities



Proposal pt. 4: Outreach and Engagement

Letter of Interest (LOI) outreach:

- Engage 1-1 to determine interest/capacity in earlier-thanintended programming
- Connect with Change Well Project for TA to support submission of Program Funding Request at base amount

Below-base submission outreach:

- Engage 1-1 to determine interest/capacity to accept more funds than originally intended and see if other funding streams or local circumstances justify below-base submission
- Connect with Change Well Project for TA to work through budgeting considerations

Business Process & Administrative Considerations

Three Main Steps:

- 1. Conditional Award Letter
- 2. MOU Execution
- 3. Statewide Fiscal Letter

Note: these timelines are estimates subject to change

Award Letters mid-Feb.: 30 days to accept MOU discussions begin mid-March (or earlier):

1-3 months (varies)

MOU Business Process:

45 days to complete

Statewide Fiscal Letter:

1-2 months

Your community has the flexibility to build out your programs and make decisions about prioritization at the community level — you are the makers of your universe.

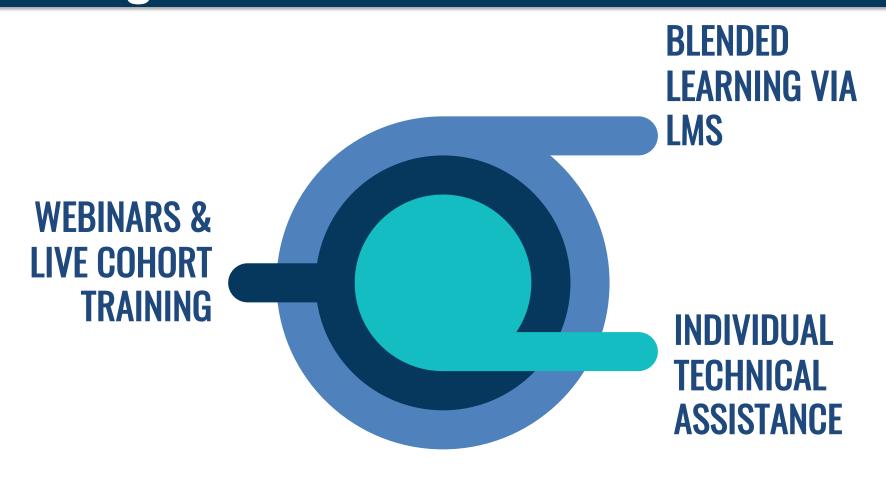
There are strategies we can work through in TA to maximize impact. A few examples...

- Partner CDSS funds with other funding sources.
 - HHAP, HomeKey, and NAHSDA. Programs that already target elders in your community.
- Share staffing and service delivery across CDSS funding streams.
 - Program policies, program intake processes, and case management teams can be shared across funding streams.

Capacity Building & Training

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Goal: To provide capacity-building and training that addresses all required levels—system-level thinking, program design, and client-level practice.
