What is a Consultative Exam?

- Disability Determination Services (DDS) schedules a CE when they think the medical records need to be developed further
- Doctors are picked by and paid by Social Security
- Often very quick & cursory
- Usually more harm than good
 - Can be helpful if no better option exists to develop records – rarely





BEWARE the Consultative Exams!

- The CE can undercut Client's own medical providers & records
- Missing a CE can result in a denial of benefits

Consultative Exam results are routinely cited in adverse

disability decisions









Avoid the Consultative Exams

- CEs can be cancelled!
- Often the information sought is already in Client's file
- Call DDS, direct them to the relevant medical records, and ask for a cancellation





Prepare for the Consultative Exams

- Make sure Client understands:
 - This will likely be very quick, not thorough
 - The person doing CE is NOT Client's doctor
- Focus on most severe symptoms & worst days
- Do not discuss unrelated conditions
- Make sure Client gets there!
 - You can try to reschedule as needed
